On a Wing And a Prayer

From Jan's Desk

The summer months certainly were busy at the Pantry. In addition to our Summer Lunch Program (providing each registered family with children additional food while the children are home all day), we also held our Sneaker Program (providing 429 brand new pairs of designer sneakers and socks to each school-aged child, veteran and senior). This year, through the generosity of one of our donors, we acquired an ice cream truck to treat everyone to ice cream during our Sneaker Distribution. We just completed our Back to School Program (providing each child with a brand new backpack and school supplies). There is no "down time", as preparations for the Thanksgiving and Christmas Distributions are well underway.

Despite the thriving economy, we have encountered more homeless people than ever before. Many of our clients have been forced to "rent a room" because they cannot afford an apartment on their own. One of our single moms with three children is living in an RV parked on a private property. The variety of hardship cases that arrive at our door is endless. We are currently assisting a couple in their late 50's. As a result of the wife having stage 4 breast cancer, the husband lost his job due to caring for his wife, which then caused them to lose their health insurance and their home in Maryland. They arrived in this area after securing a grant to receive an experimental treatment. They are living in a hotel, paid for by many churches and organizations working together, and have limited capability to cook. We have been supplying them with whatever food they can use. Another current case is a double amputee veteran preparing to move into his very first apartment. Many of these cases involve partnering with or referring them to the appropriate agencies. One thing for sure – you never leave the Pantry without counting your blessings.

We are so grateful for all of our faithful donors whose compassion allows us to continue to serve our community's needs.

On behalf of all of us at the Lord's Pantry, we would like to wish you and your families a very Happy Holiday Season!

A busy year continues for the Lord's Pantry Benefits Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP).

BEAP volunteers assisted dozens of clients with signing up for the PA Homestead Exclusion for their school taxes. The homestead exclusion is a tax relief measure that reduces school property taxes by lowering the assessed value of a property and, therefore, the amount of tax owed. Residents in the Downingtown School District typically save over \$200 a year if approved for the exclusion. BEAP volunteers, working with the Honey Brook Food Pantry, the United Way, and Legal Aid, prepared and submitted property tax assessment appeals for 177 area families who own their mobile home on a rented lot (i.e. in a mobile home park). Mobile homes depreciate rapidly but tax assessments are not lowered unless the owner appeals. All appeals were successful and the average reduction in the families' tax liability was 70%. Ten of those families were Pantry clients; factoring in the savings from the Homestead Exclusion, the average tax savings for these families was 87%. One Pantry client, a 66-year-old woman raising four grandchildren, will see her property taxes drop from \$1,178 in 2019 to around \$29 in 2020. Plans are already being made for a broader effort next year.

Beginning November 1, BEAP counselors will assist clients in applying for winter heating assistance through Pennsylvania's Low-income Heating Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Qualifying clients will receive assistance with a heating bill and will be eligible for crisis grants up to \$500 to have a heater repaired or a shut-off notice averted. Hope grows in a stable home, a warm home; it's nurtured in a trustful relationship. BEAP counselors strive to create those relationships and make hope a reality for all Pantry clients.

Thank you for your support of the Lord's Pantry that allows BEAP to provide these vital services to our clients.

Last year the Lord's Pantry served 5,821 households consisting of 17,571 individuals. That is an average of 485 households served each month. It is only through your generosity that we are able to serve our neighbors in need.

Almost 2/3 of our funds come from donations from individuals and local organizations such as churches, schools and businesses. The balance comes from grants. Unfortunately, we have not had a grant writer for almost a year, and the grants we have received have declined by more than half. We have recently engaged a new grant writer and expect to remedy this situation.

The real message is how much we depend on you for the financial support needed to fulfill our mission. However, our philosophy is not to inundate our donors with numerous solicitations. We are deeply grateful for what you have done and we are hopeful that you will continue to support the Lord's Pantry.
