From Jan's Desk

Our summer months were extremely busy as we continued our Summer Lunch Program that served 898 children in our registered families with extra kid-friendly food bags through the summer. In addition, each school age child received a brand new backpack, school supplies and a gift card to buy new sneakers to prepare for the new school year. We are currently in the process of distributing gift cards for new shoes to all of our Seniors and Veterans.

Inflation has affected all of us but has devastated many of our neighbors who were already struggling to make ends meet. After many government programs have been stopped or cut back, numerous families are returning after years of being self-sufficient. Some families have confided in us that without the assistance they get through the Lord's Pantry they would not be able to keep food on their tables.

There are no two days alike at the Pantry, and Linda and I have received a multitude of requests for assistance with anything from eviction notices, water and electric shut offs, gas money and clothing. We partner with many organizations, and by each of us contributing a small portion of what is needed, many families are assisted. We have had clients tell us they have enough gas to get to the Pantry but not enough to get them back home. Some of their specific needs are discovered through interaction with our volunteers when they shop. We had a client who passed on a certain food selection because he could only heat food on an electric burner. A special fund set up by a donor, enabled us to purchase a small microwave.

We have encountered many stressful and challenging situations, such as a mom with three children called hysterical because her water was shut off during the heat wave this summer. We have delivered food to a pop-up camper that a homeless disabled couple was living in, a wooded area where a 66 year old diabetic man was living, hotel rooms, a young couple living in their car parked in a box store parking lot and a furnished room attached to a barn that a family of four occupies. Needless to say, we have to modify our distribution to meet their capability of safely storing the food. I know it is difficult to believe that people are living like this in the richest county in Pennsylvania. We try our best to refer some of them to other resources but unfortunately, due to their emotional state, not all make wise choices.



Christmas will be handled the same as last year - by providing parents with gift cards to shop for their children. Although I know this disappoints many of our donors who enjoy shopping for our children, but the up side is that these gift cards empower parents to do shopping they would otherwise not be able to afford.

None of this would be possible without your generous support or the unwavering dedication of all of our volunteers.
